Join us in conversation with multimedia journalist **Jason Motlagh**, who is visiting campus as a grantee with the Pulitzer Center on Crisis Reporting.

Jason is a writer, photographer, filmmaker and contributing editor to *VQR*.

Formerly *TIME* magazine's Kabul correspondent, he has reported from more than forty countries spanning West Africa to Southeast Asia for *The Washington Post*, *The Economist* and *BusinessWeek*.

In 2010, he won the National Magazine Award for News Reporting for "Sixty Hours of Terror," a four-part *VQR* series on the Mumbai terror attacks.

His essay, "The Ghosts of Rana Plaza," was a finalist for the 2015 National Magazine Award in Reporting and winner of the Overseas Press Club's Madeline Dane Ross award for best international reporting on the human condition, along with the Daniel Pearl Award for best reporting on South Asia.
