
Immigration Project Description

You will be interviewing someone who migrated to the United States. The purpose of this interview is to listen to the story they have to share as an individual. As a class, we have compiled a list of questions available on the document titled “Interview Script”. You should ask as many questions as the person is comfortable answering.

When planning your interview, you should remember to include the following:

- Ask the person you would like to interview if you have their permission to record the interview
- Read the disclaimer at the top of script (reminds interviewee that they have the right to not answer questions)
- Have your questions in front of you and in order ready to ask
- Decide how you are going to record the interview
- Set up your interview time and confirm this date and time with your interviewee
- Record your interview beginning from when you read the disclaimer
- Listen to your interview and decide where you will be adding voiceover to either clarify or add information
- Record your voiceover introduction, additional information, and conclusion
