Boil Order Facts

Has this happened before?

We are unsure, but we believe this has happened or almost happened before. The boil order issued for thousands of Southwest side residents because of a century-old pumping

When boiled water is not available, people are advised to bring water to a full rolling boil for 1 minute. After boiling allow the water to cool before using.

Brain-damaging, DNA-changing, lead found in tap water from most Illinois communities during the past 6 years, Tribune analysis finds

Boil Water advisories usually include advice such as using bottled or boiled water for drinking and preparing food.

The pumping plant is located in Roseland, IL.

How long

The boil order lasted about 24 to 48 hours

The boil order was located in Beverly and Morgan Park neighborhoods.

A boil order is drinking water being contaminated. Water should be brought to a roiling boil for at least five minutes in order to ensure safety.



At issue are not only the immediate economic contributions of lift passes or equipment purchases, but the money that Americans spend on everything else they consume when they go out into the cold, from rental cars and hotel rooms to meals in restaurants.

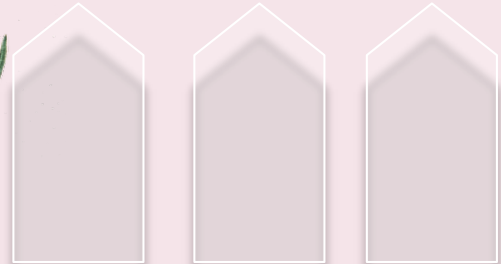
America's cold-weather recreation sector has a particularly big stake in warming winters. Activities from downhill skiing to ice fishing and outdoor ice hockey all rely on low temperatures, ample snowfall, or both. Every year, winter recreation contributes billions of dollars to the United States' economy. Winter sports also represent an important part of the country's cultural heritage. Climate change is putting those benefits in danger.



Spring Information



These environmental changes cause many trees and spring wildflowers to bloom earlier than typical. As a result, winters are shorter, spring is earlier, summers are longer and fall arrives later. The US EPA uses leaf and bloom dates reflecting national phenology trends to indicate climate change.



Summer Information

A hotter and longer summer will suffer more frequent and intensified high-temperature events — heatwaves and wildfires, Zhu said. Additionally, warmer, shorter winters may cause instability that leads to cold surges and winter storms, much like the recent snowstorms in Texas and Israel.



Autumn Information



Climate change in autumn shifts times of leaf fall, bird migration, and other events. These shifts change carbon dynamics and can favor invasive species. Autumn remains a neglected season in climate change research in temperate and arctic.
