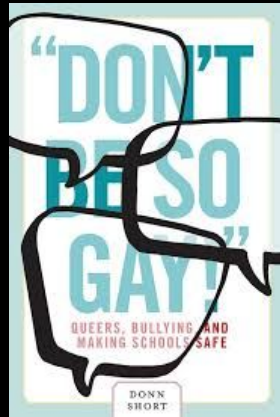


Homophobia In Schools

What is an underreported story?

An underreported story is an important story that is not commonly shared.

One example of a underreported story is the story of a trans girl, Mazy. Mazy got bullied and taunted at school just for being who she wanted to be.

This is an underreported story because not many people know about this girl. They don't pay attention to her, because she is trans. You may have noticed, but black people, women, and LGBTQ+ individuals are not commonly talked out on the news. Instead, they are discriminated because of who they are.



What is an underreported story we need to study?
