Op-Ed/Open Letter Peer Editing

As you read your partner's work, consider each of the following questions. Feel free to jot down feedback to your partner on this sheet or directly on your partner's draft.

1. Is the intro/lead engaging? Why? If not, offer a suggestion about what your partner could do to better hook the reader.
2. Does the work clearly lay out the global health issue and discuss the following items:
 - a. Is the health issue explored current/still happening?
 - b. Where?
 - c. To what degree?
 - d. Why is this issue happening?
 - e. What are the historical contexts, and who is affected?
3. Does the work include at least three pieces of evidence about why this issue is important and/or what should be done?
4. Does the article reference at least one Pulitzer Center story?
5. Do you see evidence of engagement with ethos, logos, pathos?
6. Is there a specific call to action? Does this writer tell readers what they can/should do in the face of this global health issue?
7. Does the writer acknowledge a counter argument and refute it?
8. Is the kicker/clincher powerful enough to leave the reader ready to take action?
