Stephanie Sinclair is a documentary photographer who contributes regularly to *National Geographic*, *The New York Times Magazine*, *TIME*, *Newsweek*, among others. Cynthia Gorney became a professor of journalism at the UC Berkeley Graduate School of Journalism after a career at *The Washington Post* that included serving as a national features writer and South American bureau chief. She is a contributing writer for *The New York Times Magazine* and *National Geographic*. Through deeply moving words and photography, Sinclair and Gorney will present their award-winning journalistic journey uncovering the underground world of child marriage, which spans continents, language, religion and caste. Their project was done in conjunction with *National Geographic* and the Pulitzer Center on Crisis Reporting in Washington, D.C.
