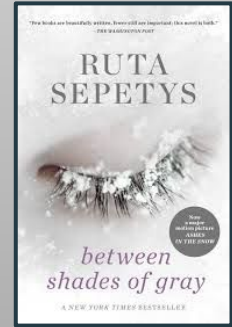

Lesson Title

“Objects in the Mirror are Closer Than They Appear”:
The Global Health Threat of International Conflict - DAY 2

Content Goal



Students will explore how an international conflict can impact global health and explore advocacy approaches to raise awareness about this issue. They will connect their reading of *BSG* to a more contemporary global health issue.

Language Goal



Students will read an under-reported story and use Harvard Project Zero thinking routines to reflect on and discuss the story. They will also draft an advocacy piece to explain the significance of their findings.

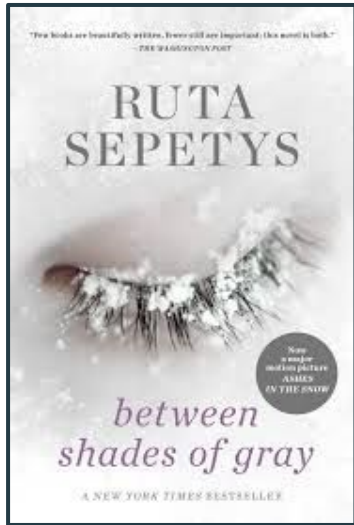

Democratic Republic of the Congo starts mpox vaccination in high-priority provinces

UNICEF and partners welcome the rollout of the first vaccines which offer one more tool to protect children and communities from the disease

A total of 265,000 doses of the MVA-BN mpox vaccine arrived in Kinshasa in September, donated by the EU, the US, and Gavi - the Vaccine Alliance - with support from Africa CDC. UNICEF organized the shipment, customs clearance and delivery of the vaccines to DRC. Gavi provided valuable funds towards the costs for vaccination readiness and delivery undertaken by the Ministry of Health, UNICEF and WHO.

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Advocating for Global Health - Mini-Project!

OPTION B: Draft an infographic-style flyer with text, graphics, quotes, and images to raise awareness about the ways that wartime conflict in far-away places is contributing to the spread of AMR and how your peers can take action to alert appropriate people in power.

OPTION C: Draft a 2.5 minute “talking head” video to inform others about AMR, share that it is an increasing global threat, and explain what your audience can do to raise awareness and combat this problem before it becomes a crisis.
