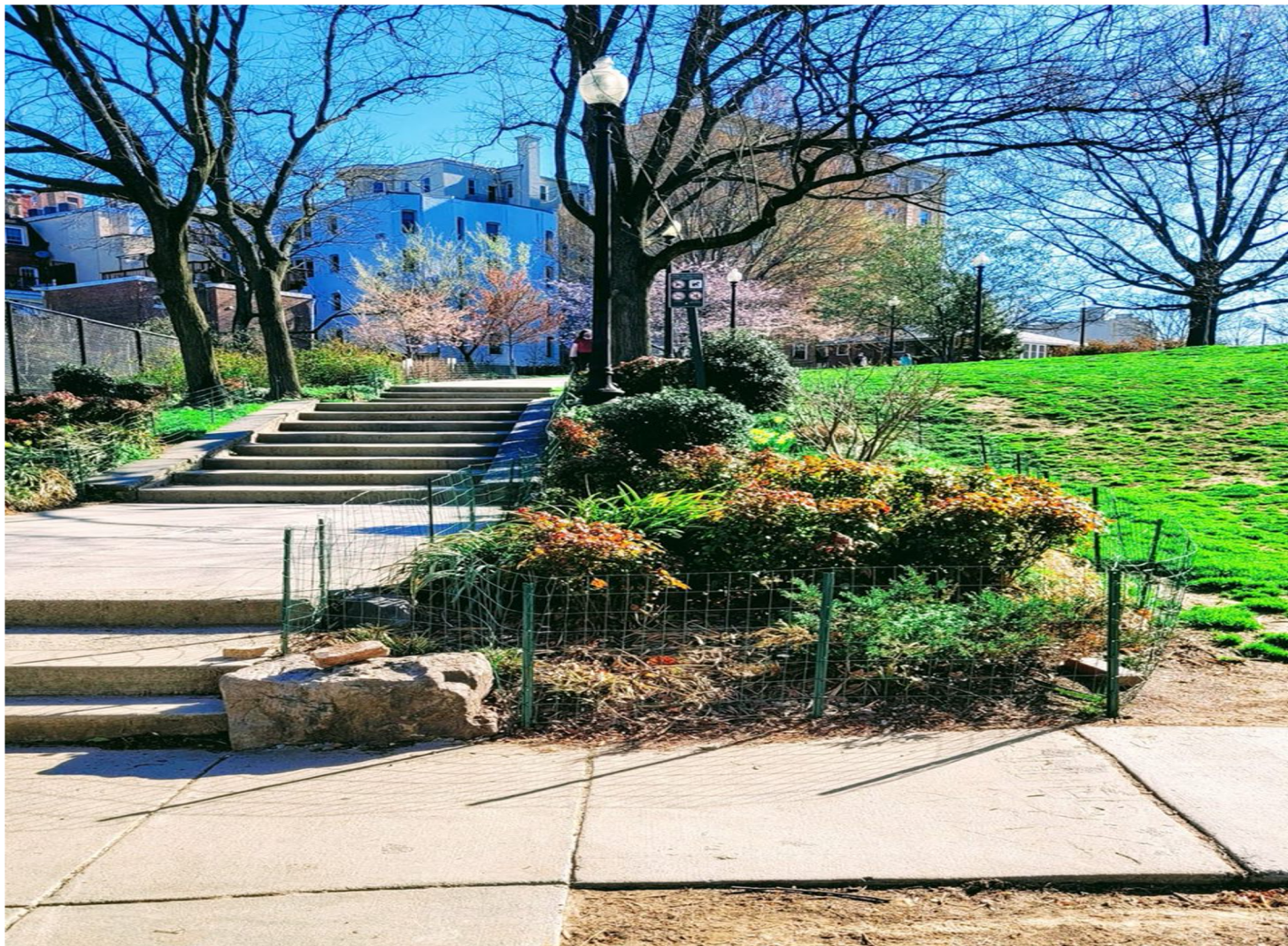

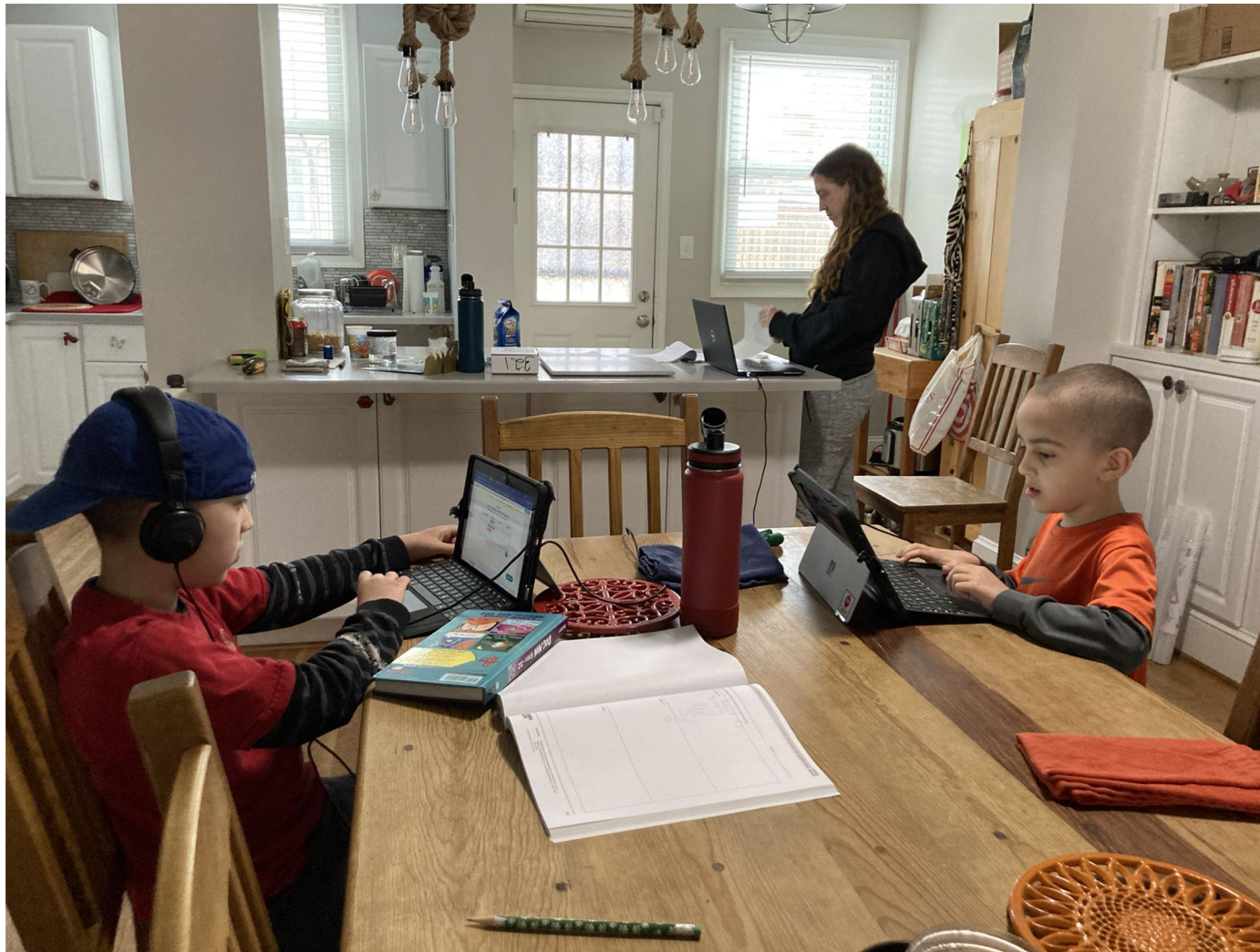
Renewed Hope
