That is not a power that the government should have in a democracy" Through this passage we can infer that the only reason for a government to have this type of surveillance system is to threaten and infuse fear into protesters.

What makes this even more controversial it its unefficiency. The project was made with main goal of using the video data to reduce crime yet it let so much to desire. this is evident in the following "after more than 700 hours aloft over the city, just one arrest has been made with aid from the program's imagery data, according to BDP" Through this example we learn that this project is not only a failure but a waste of money.
